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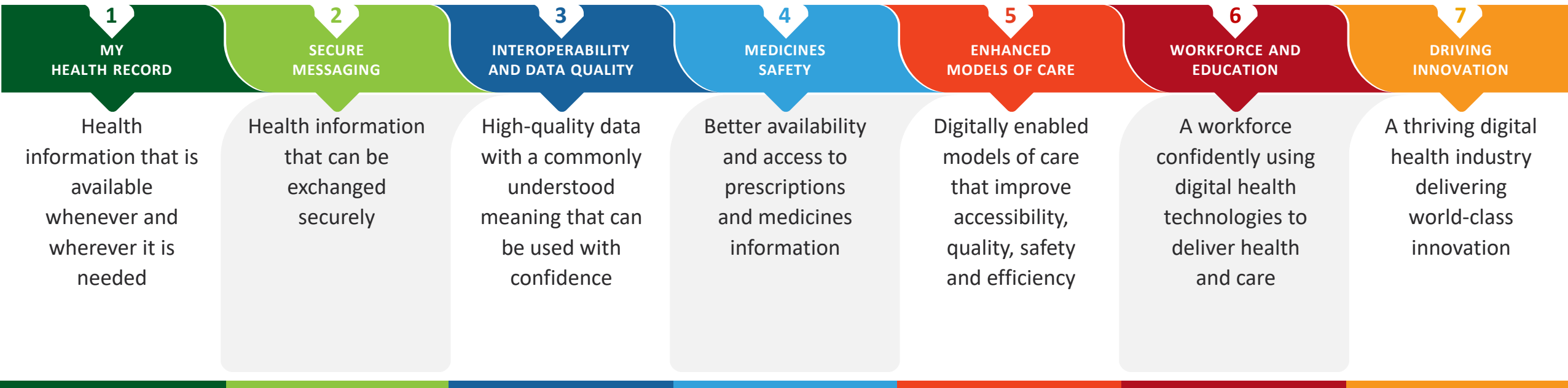

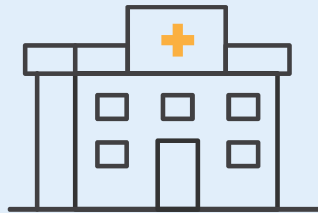

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# Case Study Raylee

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# Case study - Raylee

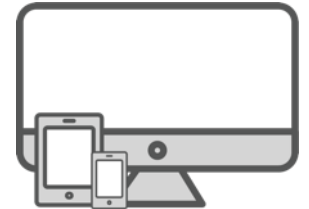
Raylee (55 years) attends medical practice following ED presentation for acute exacerbation of her asthma.

Raylee has had asthma since childhood and although for many months of the year her asthma is well controlled (during this time she often reduces or stops her inhaled steroids), she experiences two or three exacerbations a year. These are usually triggered by viral upper respiratory infection, although last summer when the pollen count was particularly high she became tight chested and wheezy for a couple of weeks.

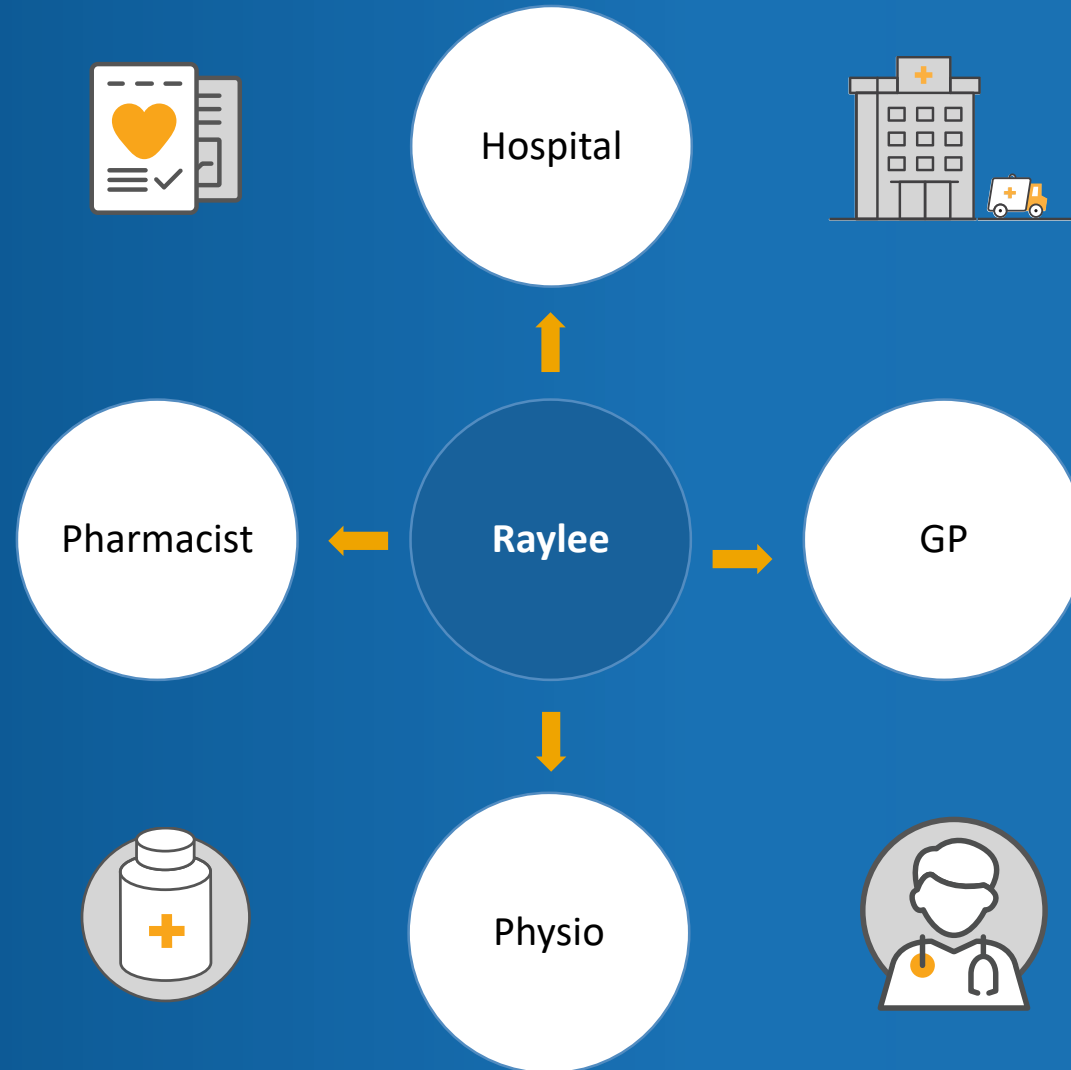
Raylee was discharged from hospital and told to follow-up with her GP.

## What information will healthcare professionals require to assist in treating this patient?

- Patient history - Background required to determine chronic asthma severity and the severity of the recent acute attack
- Allergies
- Medications
- Vaccinations
