



What is My Health Record?

What is **My Health Record**?



It is <u>protected</u> – by legislation with strong privacy and security mechanisms



It is accessible at all times – including at point of care



It is <u>personally controlled</u> – the individual can choose what gets uploaded, what stays in their record, and who can see their record




It is part of a <u>national system</u> – an individual's My Health Record is available wherever they are and no matter which registered healthcare provider they are seeing




It is a online summary of an individual's **key health information**, securely in one place. It is available to the individual and their healthcare providers when and where they need it, including in an emergency.





My Health Record security



Many safeguards are in place to protect the information held in the My Health Record system, such as strong encryption, firewalls, secure login processes and audit logging.



- The My Health Record system is monitored by the Cyber Security Centre within the Australian Digital Health Agency.
- External software goes through a conformance process before it is allowed to connect to the system.
- The privacy of information in the My Health Record system is protected by legislation. Significant penalties apply for deliberate misuse of this information.



All data within the My Health Record system is stored securely in Australia.








Consumer control









Consumers can choose to restrict access to specific documents in their My Health Record by setting a code (LDAC)

Only organisation given the LDAC can access those documents Consumers can restrict access to their record by setting a code (RAC)

Only organisations given the code can access any part of their My Health Record In an emergency, a clinician can exercise a 'break glass' facility to allow temporary access

Consumers can choose to receive a SMS or email alert when a health provider organisation accesses their My Health Record


All instances of access to My Health Record are monitored and logged

What is an Event Summary?

An event summary captures key health information about **significant** healthcare events that are relevant to the ongoing care of an individual


Interaction with My Health Record: a practical example

Caleb Derrington, 85 years old

- Your next patient is Caleb. He has been a patient of this practice for a long while.
- He went to Brisbane to spend a few months with his daughter and returned home 2 weeks ago.
- He is booked in for his yearly health assessment with you today.
- Caleb mentions he was a bit unwell recently and saw a GP in Brisbane who gave him a script for antibiotics but he decided not to take it.






Health Assessment: Pneumovax








Health Assessment: New diagnosis







New Shared Health Summary



It may be considered good clinical practice to advise a patient that you will be uploading information to their My Health Record, particularly if this information might be considered sensitive. This approach is recommended by the Australian Medical Association in its guide to using the My Health Record system (section 4.5).

How did My Health Record help you and Caleb?

Nurse	Caleb
Access to AIR data showed immunisation status	Received immunisation, avoiding possible hospitalisation
Learned of his recent illness and the medicine that was prescribed	Received education about alerting new health care providers with his allergies
Educate patient about his Advance Care Directive and how My Health Record could help him with having his wishes respected	Ability to have his wishes respected when in an emergency
Shared up-to-date and accurate information about Caleb	If Caleb was attended by a health care provider who did not know his history – they would be able to provide him with the best of care as relevant information was available.



- Pharmacist Shared Medicines List (PSML) (Pharmacies)

Medicines View – Medicines tab



Also coming soon - a Pharmacist Shared Medicines List (PSML)

- A list of medicines that a patient may be taking including:
 - ✓ Prescribed by the patient's doctor
 - ✓ Any non-prescription medicines e.g. over-thecounter
 - ✓ Any complementary medicines such as vitamins and herbal medicines
- Only a pharmacist can prepare and upload a PSML document to a patient's My Health Record at this stage
- A link to the most recent PSML will also be provided in the Medicines Information view.

Key Considerations

Who can create a shared health summary?

- A shared health summary can be created and uploaded to the My Health Record system by:
 - a Registered Medical Practitioner
 - a Registered Nurse
 - an Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Health Practitioner with a Cert IV in Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander Primary Health Care
 - where there is an agreement in place that the healthcare provider is the individual's Nominated Healthcare Provider
- A patient can have only one nominated healthcare provider at a time, who should be
 delivering coordinated and comprehensive care to the individual. Note: a provider
 who is not the patient's usual provider could use an event summary instead to
 upload clinically relevant information to the patient's My Health Record.



Viewing, uploading and removing

- Authorisation to view and upload and upload exists except for uploading when:
 - A Shared Health Summary is uploaded for the first time for by you for your patient (an agreement with the patient is required to establish a Nominated Provider relationship)
 - The patient indicates that they do not want the document to be uploaded
 - Certain State or Territory laws require consent to upload certain sensitive health information
 - Not providing healthcare (You must not view if providing an insurance/pre-employment assessment)
- No obligation to view / upload
- Provider organisations can update ('supersede') and remove documents which they have authored
- Emergency access



Withholding uploads

- o By law you must not upload a document if the patient requests for it to not be uploaded
- Ensure you are aware about <u>how to withhold the upload</u>
- Ensure you note the withhold in your clinical notes
- Documents which upload by default
 - Prescription records
 - Pathology reports (via request form)
 - Diagnostic imaging reports (via request form)
 - Dispense records
 - Discharge Summaries

Medico-Legal Aspects

Uploading incorrect information

Healthcare provider organisations are under an obligation to take reasonable steps to upload **accurate and up-to-date** information (this obligation already exists when sharing patient information with other providers)

Acting on incorrect information

My Health Record aids in clinical decisionmaking and providers should rely on their own clinical judgement when using third party information

Data Quality Checklist for all 'active' patients

- Demographics are the contact details up-to-date?
 - Double-click on the patient's telephone number to check and update details
- Medication List is the Current Meds list accurate?
 - Right click to delete/cease medications no longer relevant (they can then be found in the Old/Past Scripts thereafter)
 - · If none, tick No medications
- Past History List does it contain only significant conditions that a hospital or specialist would need to know?
 - · Right click to edit, delete or add new
 - If none, tick No significant past history (PMH) box
- 4 Allergies have you also recorded adverse reactions?
 - Double-click in allergies box and Add, Edit, Delete
 - If none, tick No Known Allergies/Adverse Reactions/Nil Known
- Immunisations have immunisations been recorded?

- o If you no longer require access to My Health Record, ask the organisation to disable your access
- Always keep your password secure and not share it with others
- When you join a new organisation provide them with your HPI-I so you can access My Health Record to provide care to your patients
- Participate in ongoing training (Take part in local face-to-face training sessions or online training on My Health Record)
- o Find out how you can view and upload within your clinical software
