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



What is **My Health Record**?

It is **<u>protected</u>** – by legislation with strong privacy and security mechanisms

It is accessible at all times – including at point of care

It is **personally controlled** – the individual can choose what gets uploaded, what stays in their record, and who can see their record

It is part of a **national system** – an individual's My Health Record is available wherever they are and no matter which registered healthcare provider they are seeing

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It is a online summary of an individual's <u>key health information</u>, securely in one place. It is available to the individual and their healthcare providers when and where they need it, including in an emergency.





Overall market snapshot



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How can healthcare providers interact and use the **My Health Record?**

Access to My Health Record – Authorised Clinicians



Authorised clinicians are only able to view My Heath Record via one of the following ways:

 Conformant Clinical Software (CIS)

The Provider Portal (view only)

In Addition a number of other security criteria must be met:

- Layers of security for practitioner and practice to be recognised by My Heath Record system
- The practitioner and clinical information system requires a number of personal details about the patient
- Patient must grant access if consumer privacy controls have been set

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Pathology and Diagnostic Imaging reports: Seven day delay



Pathology or Radiology Report is uploaded to My Health Record as soon as it is verified Results not visible to the patient for seven calendar days Requesting Doctor has time to review the results and discuss with patient Patient has access to the report after seven days

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Multidisciplinary team involved



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Case Study:

Ella Age 7-10 Birth 6yrs 7-10 yrs

Ella has follow-up imaging but forgets her original films at home

She requires increased dental examinations due to chemotherapy administration before permanent dentition

Returns to school with learning difficulties and issues fitting back to routine/school life

Ella Age 26 Birth 6yrs 7-10 yrs 26yrs


20 years later, Ella is planning a family

Ella has a higher risk of developing cardiac issues, breast cancer and reduced fertility as a result of the treatment for her childhood lymphoma

The My Health Record system is supported by a legislative framework that sets controls around who can access the system and the information contained within.



Withholding uploads

By law you must not upload a document if the patient requests for it to not be uploaded

Ensure you are aware about how to withhold the upload



Ensure you note the withhold in your clinical notes

Documents which upload by default:

- Prescription records
- Pathology reports*
- Diagnostic imaging reports*
- Dispense records
- Discharge Summaries





For young people from 14 years of age

- Parents are automatically removed as Authorised representatives from the young person's My Health Record.
- The young person can manage their own My Health Record.
- The young person can choose to nominate a parent, guardian or other person as a Nominated Representative and grant appropriate level of access if they wish.





Nominated vs Authorised Representatives

Nominated Representative



Authorised Representative

A person chosen by the individual to have access to their My Health Record, such as a family member. An authorised representative is responsible for managing the My Health Record of someone who cannot manage their own.

This could be for their child under 14 years, or an adult who lacks the capacity to manage their own record. The authorised representative has complete access and control over the record, as if it was their own.



My Health Record security



Many safeguards are in place to protect the information held in the My Health Record system, such as strong encryption, firewalls, secure login processes and audit logging.

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- The My Health Record system is monitored by the Cyber Security Centre within the Australian Digital Health Agency.
- External software goes through a conformance process before it is allowed to connect to the system.
- The privacy of information in the My Health Record system is protected by legislation. Significant penalties apply for deliberate misuse of this information.





Consumers can choose to restrict access to specific documents in their My Health Record by setting a code (LDAC)


Only organisation given the LDAC can access those documents Consumers can restrict access to their record by setting a code (RAC)

Only organisations given the code can access any part of their My Health Record In an emergency, a clinician can exercise a **'break glass'** facility to allow temporary access Consumers can choose to receive a **SMS or email alert** when a health provider organisation accesses their My Health Record All instances of access to My Health Record are **monitored and logged**





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Pharmacist Shared Medicines List (PSML)


- A list of medicines that a patient may be taking including:
 - ✓ Prescribed by the patient's doctor
 - ✓ Any non-prescription medicines e.g. overthe-counter
 - Any complementary medicines such as vitamins and herbal medicines
- Only a pharmacist can prepare and upload a PSML document to a patient's My Health Record at this stage
- A link to the most recent PSML will also be provided in the Medicines Information view.
